**SUBJECT:** Clarification Regarding Dosing Intervals for Hepatitis A Vaccine

(HAV)

Effective October 1, 2013, the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is clarifying the policy for hepatitis A vaccination. This policy will allow every child to have up to 18 months after the first dose of hepatitis A vaccine to receive the second dose, before being considered delinquent for the series. This policy is consistent with the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP), at <a href="http://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/hcp/acip-recs/vacc-specific/hepa.html">http://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/hcp/acip-recs/vacc-specific/hepa.html</a>.

The policy does not change the initial hepatitis A vaccine requirements for child-care or school entry requirement of two doses. For example, during 2013/14, children enrolled in child-care are required to obtain the first dose by 25 months of age. For public and private schools, children (kindergarten through 4<sup>th</sup> grade) are required to have 2 doses of hepatitis A vaccine.

Further, the minimum interval for VAQTA® and Havrix® is 6 months, and there is no maximum interval. At 6 months, parents may be reminded about the requirements for the second dose, but not required to have the second dose until 18 months after the first.
